





How I got Started in Pin Collecting by John Leggett

How (WHY?) I got started Pin Trad-

As a kid I had no spare money so we picked a 'free' hobby. We had American servicemen in the city so saw usual cigarette packets and match boxes so we started to collect them and started albums. We searched the streets especially on Sunday mornings to find them. Then as I made 12 years I worked and did jobs, joined the army cadets and started to collect military badges and medals!

The collecting dropped off as a teenager and when I worked, got married and had kids. I did continue with the medals and started on police badges! Whilst in the police I started on producing and collecting charity pins. Thats where Rupert Bear started, in the early years we would sell over a million a year!

Then over 30years ago when I made it into the lions it was natural I started on those pins. The 1998

convention in Birmingham got me in big time and also the LITPC, my brain must have got fogged up as here I am today with an office full, 30,000 plus, who knows, and considerably poorer!

I live in bomber county, we had 100 airfields in the state during WW2, so that got me into planes. Next year is my series 18, fitting as it will be the 100th anniversary of the formation of the RAF from the RFC (army) and RNAS (navy).

In those early years of flying many well off americans had learned to fly but you had no air force. Many wanted to fly and fight, america was not in the war so many came to England via Canada and joined the RFC here. So you find many american aces with British medals. Such pilots were Hibert Bair DFC (GB) and DSC(USA) and Lawrence Challaham DFC(GB) and Silver Star (USA). When America entered the war in 1917 they had no Air Service so these guys all transferred over

and were the backbone of the new USA Air Service. Once again we colonials helped you out!

Thats enough History, 13 years I have been coming to Reno and alot of great people I have met there, not enough time or space to relate the stories. Suffice to say that SOAB still will not let me have a pin in the annual set! (but I still drink his beer!) Love you Joe.

Hope you enjoy the 35 pin set for A Knight of the Blind I put together, see you all in Chicago or Reno maybe, Have fun collecting, John L
