CLPTA: How it all got Started

In July of 1983 Lion Al Stack approached me with the idea of a District 4-C7 pin, since the District (only 3 years old) had never had one. Hal Tavalero was District Governor and I was Cabinet Secretary. Al's idea was the walking bear, a two pin set, with the golden bears walking towards each other. Governor Hal liked the idea but stated his budget was already approved by the delegates in May so there was no money in the budget to pay for the pins manufacture nor could the District accept any funds from the sale of the pins.

Al decided he would front the funds for the pins manufacture and if there were any profits we would figure that out later. Well there were profits and we came up with the idea of a California Pin Club. Many other states had pin clubs including Nevada which was part of MD-4. We talked to Governor Hal(Council Chairman 1983-84) and agreed to put me on the agenda for the August Council Meeting. I made a presentation to the Council of Governors in August of 1983, explaining the benefits of a State pin Club, which would allow the production of a California State Pin in addition to the MD-4 pin annually. Nevada was already doing this and had been since 1969. The Council of Governors approved the creation of a California Pin Traders Club as an approved MD-4 activity.

We had profits from the sale of the Golden Bear sets of approximately \$1500.00, the set was a hit in 4-C7. I arranged for meeting space, rooms, and meals at the FReasno Holiday Inn. I believe that was scheduled for the late spring of 1984. Al, Kaye and I put together packets of information, probably 5 or 6 sheets of paper, explaining what we were trying to create, including hotel information, costs and an agenda for our meeting on Saturday. We spent several evenings at the Stack's shop in Petaluma putting together 955 packets which were mailed out to every club in California. We almost burned up their copy machine, but we got it done.

I don't remember just how many Lions came to that meeting, probably 12 to 15, but we had an organinzational meeting and the California Lions Pin Traders Association (CLPTA) was born. Al Stack was our Charter President, Al Funk was our Charter Vice President, I was Charter Secretary and Kaye Stack was our Charter Treasurer.

Our first club pin was designed for the International Convention in Dallas (1985) and the California State Pin was designed for the International Convention in New Orleans (1986). We have not missed a year since.

Al and I met with Mike Barskey, at the 4-C7 Convention in 1985 to discuss a news letter. Mike agreed to be our bulletin editor and the Bear News was born. It was issued four times a year and was actually a newspaper in the early years.

During a CLPTA swap in Ontario, California in 1988 we had pin traders from Arizona, Washington, Utah, Oregon and Idaho either in attendance, or by phone, expressing a desire to host a combined pin swap. The idea was well accepted by those in attendance and the Western States Pin Swap was born. We were in Arizona in 1989, Sacramento in 1990 and 1991. Because Reno was sorta centrally located the Board decided to stay in Reno. We were at the Holiday Inn on Wells street until 2003 when we moved to Circus Circus in 2004. We did go to Las Vegas one year (2008) at the request of the Board. That was a bust and we returned to Circus Circus in 2009 where we have been ever since.

A Lot of Pin Traders have contributed a ton of work and effort over the years in making the CLPTA what it has grown to be over these past 33 years. I personally thank each and every one of you, because without your energy, input and knowledge we wouldn't have survived. Hopefully we'll have another 33 years (or more) with the help of you pin trading Lions who are the core of the CLPTA.


