Hi, I am Lion Joe Trezza. I am in Charge of Obtaining high quality pins for the Reno Western States Swap Auction this October 14th –16th. If you would like to put an item in the auction please contact me by phone (925) 864-2927 or e-mail me at jetlion@comcast.net. Lion Tim McCaulley of Pennsylvania will be assisting me. He will be coordinating the auction list with me.

We will be having a pre-bid option this year. You will be able to put in one bid remotely by email ahead of the Live Auction. Your bid will be the starting bid for the item. If you make it high enough you will be the winner. It would be better if you came out to the swap, then you can bid as many times as you want for an item.

I have over 50 items so far. Get to me as soon as you can before I reach our limit. Don't be left out.

I will send out a complete auction catalog on or around Sept 15th.

A few of the items I have so far are: Va. Jorge Bird, Vermont Prestige Sccor Ball, 1974 NM Prestige Roadrunner, 78 Large Hawaii Prestige, New York 64 Charm, New York 64 Silver,


